Recommendations and Action Items

RECOMMENDATIONS MIRRORING EXISTING COMMISSION PRIORITIES

- **Birth Centers and Midwives**: updating regulations, improving level of reimbursement, and developing pathways for CPM's
- **Doula workforce**: collaborating with doulas to create a pathway to formal certification
- Home visiting: working with providers, insurance carriers, and others to expand the reach of universal postpartum home visiting
- Fetal and Infant Mortality Review & Count the Kicks: conducting active, populationbased surveillance for stillbirths, which would provide data to a FIMR, and supporting an annual Count the Kicks campaign for prevention

ADDITIONAL RECOMMENDATIONS OF NOTE

- Levels of Maternal Care (LoMC): implement a tiered system defining personnel and resources for the provision of maternal care at each level, to include birth centers at the lowest tier (i.e. for the lowest risk patients/births)
- **Community health centers:** all federally qualified health centers in MA to provide prenatal and postnatal care on site
- Maternal Mortality and Morbidity Review Committee: statutory expansion of MMMRC's ability to collect relevant information from any public and private agency or individual
- Parenthood and Fatherhood Experiences Survey: annual reporting from survey to support engagement and partnership with families, fathers, and other second parents in order to improve maternal and child health
- **Outpatient intensive or partial hospitalization program:** explore establishment and ongoing implementation of Outpatient Intensive or Partial Hospitalization programs and develop inpatient behavioral health programs where infants can board with their mother during mental health treatment
